Joseph M. Anain, Sr., MD, FACS, and Paul M. Anain, MD, FACS

Dr. Joseph Anain, Sr. is one of the most respected vascular surgeons in Western New York and a leading pioneer in the field. His career at Sisters Hospital began more than four decades ago following vascular and angiology fellowships at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation. Since that time, he has performed thousands of procedures becoming one of the nation's leading vascular and endovascular surgery specialists.

Dr. Anain, Sr. started the first diagnostic angiography suite at Sisters of Charity Hospital in 1967, breaking new ground in performing percutaneous selective catheterization directly into the blood vessels. In 1968, he made local medical history, placing the first implantable peripheral stent into a patient in Western New York. At that time, he worked closely with Dr. Anthony Manzella, another well-respected Buffalo area surgeon, until Dr. Manzella's retirement in 1988.

In 1999, Dr. Anain made local medical news once again by performing the first endoluminal aortic stent graft in Western New York for the treatment of abdominal aortic aneurysm. It was this same year that Dr. Anain's son Paul, also a vascular surgeon, joined his father's surgical practice. Dr. Paul Anain completed his medical training at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation, with advanced fellowships in vascular surgery at the University at Buffalo and endovascular surgery at University of California at Los Angeles.

Together, Dr. Joseph Anain, Sr. and Dr. Paul Anain have performed nearly 1,000 endoluminal stent graft procedures, placing the Vascular & Endovascular Center of Western New York among the top three percent nationally of vascular surgery practices.

In 2004, after attending an endovascular neurointervention fellowship at Texas Tech Medical Center, the Anains created the Catholic Health System's first carotid stent program for carotid artery disease at Sisters of Charity Hospital.



James M.T. Foster, MBBS, MBA, FRCPC

Dr. Foster currently serves as the clinical chief of service for anesthesia at Kaleida Health, clinical associate professor of anesthesiology at the University at Buffalo, and attending anesthesiologist at Women & Children's Hospital of Buffalo. He is also board president for CGF Anesthesiology Associates, is a member of the medical executive committee for Kaleida Health, and serves on the Kaleida Health operating room committee.

As chief medical officer of Women & Children's Hospital, Dr. Foster is responsible for the clinical, academic, educational and medical management of health care provided at the hospital. He works with hospital administrators on overall planning and leads the development and implementation of programs and practices to ensure that service delivery, quality outcomes, patient satisfaction and financial objectives are met.

Dr. Foster earned his medical degree at the London Hospital Medical College, University of London, England, is a Fellow of The Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in Anesthesia and is Board Certified by the American Board of Anesthesiology. Dr. Foster also received his MBA from Canisius College in June 2005.

D'Youville College's Achievement in Health Care Awards Dinner is scheduled for Thursday, Feb. 25, 2010, at Salvatore's Italian Gardens. The evening will begin at 6:30 with a hospitality hour, followed by a sit-down dinner and awards ceremony. Proceeds from this event are used to provide financial assistance to deserving students and to assist the development of new academic programs.

Over the decades, the United States has led in the development of new medical techniques and technology. The result of this has led to improved health and longer life for countless people around the world. Individuals and organizations in Western New York have long contributed to these accomplishments. Of their numerous achievements and milestones, some stand out as truly innovative, far-reaching and beneficial.

This year's honorees are **Dr. Joseph M. Anain, Sr.**, one of the most respected vascular surgeons in Western New York and a leading pioneer in the field. His career at Sisters of Charity Hospital began more than four decades ago following vascular and angiology fellowships at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation.

Dr. Paul M. Anain, also a vascular surgeon joined his father's surgical practice in 1999. Together, the Anains created the Catholic Health System's first carotid stent program for carotid artery disease at Sisters of Charity Hospital.

Dr. James M.T. Foster, who currently serves as the clinical chief of service for anesthesia for Kaleida Health, clinical associate professor of anesthesiology at the University at Buffalo, and chief medical officer at Women &

Children's Hospital. He works with hospital administrators on overall planning and leads the development and implementation of programs and practices to ensure that service delivery, quality outcomes, patient satisfaction and financial objectives are met.

Honorees will be presented with a unique crystal statue handcrafted by Victor Trabucco of Clarence, N.Y. The statue depicts an eagle, with wings outspread, perched on a tree branch. It symbolizes individual strength, a trait common to those who excel and reach great heights.

Founded in 1908 by the Grey Nuns of the Sacred Heart, D'Youville College was the first college in Western New York for women. It became coeducational in 1971, and now serves a population of more than 3,000 men and women from the United States, Canada and abroad. D'Youville offers baccalaureate, graduate, and doctoral programs in health care, teacher education, liberal arts, and business. With more than 40 degree programs, the college's mission is based on the spirit and values of St. Marguerite d'Youville, an 18th century religious leader who dedicated her life to serving the poor and who founded the religious order which established the college.

Throughout its history, D'Youville College has educated professionals for community

service. During the Depression, it was the first local college to prepare students in the new disciplines of sociology and social work to care for the disadvantaged and to administer the social programs which transformed the nation. As one of the region's first teacher education schools, D'Youville has provided generations of teachers for Buffalo-area schools and beyond. In 1942, during World War II, the college established the first four-year nursing degree program in the area to train caregivers for wounded veterans.

Today, more than 100 years after its founding, D'Youville College continues its legacy of service to others. An anchor on Buffalo's West Side, it provides educational opportunities through the DaVinci Magnet High School, City-as-School

program and support for various community activities. The college has implemented an Upward Bound program for college preparation at nearby Grover Cleveland High School, Buffalo's International High School, as well as a federal Nursing Workforce Diversity program with area high school youth. The Corporation for National and Community Service named D'Youville College to the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll in 2008 for exemplary service efforts and service to disadvantaged youth. The college contributes greatly to the quality of life of the neighborhood and beyond. In turn, its students emerge as enriched human beings with a love of learning and a sense of responsibility to themselves and others.
